

and who had visited Port Jackson, where he received great attention, was accused of being concerned in that dreadful Massacre, and in consequence of which, the whalers, who were at that time on the Coast, and had come into the Bay of Islands, shortly after that affair, united their force, and sent seven armed Boats, before day-break, to attack the Island of Tippahoe, where, on their landing, they shot every man, woman, and child, that came in their way; in this attack Tippahoe received seven wounds, and soon afterwards died.

Duatena and Shunghee always declared that Tippahoe was innocent of the crime for which he suffered; and that Tippahoe, of Whangaroo, committed it. — Whangaroo is situated about thirty miles nearer the north Cape, than the Bay of Islands. Tippahoe was in the habit of trading with the people of Whangaroo, and happened to go there with a cargo of fish, on the day, in which the 'Boyd' was taken, and the whole of her crew massacred. — When he arrived five only of her men were alive and in the rigging, whom he took into his own Canoe and landed them, with a view of saving their lives, but, being followed
