In the above manner the Gospel has been introduced into Newzealand, and I fervently pray, that the Glory of it may never depart from its Inhabitants till Time shall be no more.

After the service we returned on board, much gratified with the reception we had met with, and we could not but feel the strongest persuasion, that the time was at hand, when the Glory of the Lord would be revealed to these poor benighted heathen, and that those, who were to remain on the Island, had strong reason to believe, that their labours would be blessed and crowned with success. — In the evening I administered the Holy Sacrament on board the 'Actiue' — In remembrance of our Saviour's Birth and of what He had done and suffered for us. —
