

Captain to take all the coats from  
 the masts (meaning the sails,  
 for they would kill the ship. -  
 Tupaa on the other hand, was  
 quite composed during the  
 storm. he said that "neither  
 thunder, lightning, nor wind would  
 destroy the vessel <sup>while</sup> he and I remained  
 in it" - and exhorted Timoranga  
 not to be afraid for he was  
 safe enough. - Notwithstanding  
 all that Tupaa could say - Timoranga's  
 fears continued as long as the  
 Gale lasted: - he neither rested  
 by night nor by day. - Tupaa  
 was often accustomed to pray, and  
 sometimes he would have some of  
 his countrymen with him, -  
 He had a strong confidence in  
 some <sup>supreme</sup> supernatural being (the  
 God of Newzealand) as he was  
 wont to call the object of his  
 worship. - I was very sick  
 during the storm, and could seldom  
 get out of my cabb. - Tupaa  
 would sit beside me and put  
 his hand on different parts of <sup>my</sup> <sub>body</sub>
