He was a dignified and a superior character and was always the same very mild and even temper. — In this gale we were driven more than 200 miles to the northward of Port Jackson. — When the storm abated the wind became favourable to us and we anchored safely in Sydney Cove on Wednesday 23^d March 1815. —

I shall conclude this detail of the voyage by observing that the Newzealand Chiefs are a warlike race, proud of their rank and jealous of their dignity. — They seemed to be men who never forget neither a favour nor an injury. They retain a grateful remembrance of those Europeans who have been kind and faithful to them; — and a spirit of sovereign contempt and revenge to such as have abused their confidence.
