When the Chief's Brother died, in order to give satisfaction to his departed spirit, to appease his anger, and to prevent him coming again and destroying them, these two Young Women were killed, by the relatives of the departed Chief: they both belonged to the School under Mr. Rendall, at the time. Another relation of the Chief demanded the death of the young Woman who lived with Mr. Hanson, as a satisfaction, on his part, that the spirit of the departed Chief might not injure him; and, as it was the custom of the country, she delivered herself up to be killed: but the Chief, before he died, knowing that some would be sacrificed for him, had given directions that she should not be one of them, and, on that account, her life was spared. When the Active was returned to Port Jackson, the two Young Men who had been appointed to fill Towha's Female Slaves, came in her. Towha was with me at the time: Mr. Rendall informed me of the above circumstances, fearing that Towha might be angry with them when he heard of the death
