In the evening, we had a stormy passage to Sang-see-hoo, in a small canoe, with six Natives to work it. The water was rough, and the wind fresh. We were not without our fears, till safe on shore at the settlement; where we arrived after dark, highly gratified with our visit to the Natives, and thankful for our preservation; having, for some time, almost despaired of reaching the shore, as we had about seven miles to pass through a rough sea, the water frequently over the sides of the canoe.

When we arrived, I learned that Shung-see had returned from his expedition. I inquired what he had done. He informed me that he had been told, some time previous to his present voyage toward the North Cape, that the inhabitants, not far from Whanger-rooa, had taken the bones of his wife's Father from the sacred sepulchre, and had
