

We expressed our approbation of the conduct of the Natives in attending to our remonstrances, recommending them to act honestly in future; & rewarded such as had given information of thefts, or had exerted their influence to obtain the stolen property. A good understanding was soon established again between us & the Natives; & they joined their respective work as before, in sawing timber, &c.

Pomavoc paid us an early visit with King George. He told me he was very angry, that I had not brought a blacksmith for him; & that when he heard there was no blacksmith for him, he sat down and wept much, as also did his Wives. I assured him that he should have one, as soon as one could be got for him. He replied it would be of no use to him to send a Blacksmith, when he was dead; & that at present he was ^{oi} in the greatest distress: his wooden spades were all broke, and had not an axe to make any more: his canoes were all broke
