irons, and nearly 100 fish-hooks. They
received this present with the greatest
joy and gratitude, and returned to
their own districts as happy as King's
with the spoils of war.

Sept. 7, 1819. — Mr. Butler & Mr. Francis Hall
accompanied me to Tippoosah; a Native
Settlement, about two miles distant from
Ranghee-hoo. The land there is chiefly plan-
-ted with sweet potatoes, which constitute
the choicest food of the Natives. The soil
is generally rich and light, and well adap-
-ted for the growth of this root.

The principal ~~settlers~~ inhabitants of
Ranghee-hoo have their sweet-potatoe
gardens here. We found numbers of
them at work, in their respective allot-
-ments; some with spades and hoes
