from the enemy.

When the war is over, and the Head properly cured, it is sent round to all the Chiefs' friends, as a gratification to them, and to show them that justice had been obtained from the offending party.

With respect to the Body of the Chief, it is cut up into small portions, and dressed for those who are in the battle, under the immediate direction of the Chief who obtains the Head; and, if he wishes to gratify any of his friends who are not present, small portions are reserved for them; on the receipt of which they give thanks to their God for the victory obtained over their enemy.

If the flesh should be so putrid, from the length of time before it is received, that it cannot be eaten, a substitute is eaten in stead.

They not only eat the flesh of the Chiefs,
