The boat will prove the most essential service to the Settlement, from the burden of timber, lime, and stores, which she carries.

Sept. 15, 1819 - This morning I met some of the people who had returned from Whangeroa; and inquired how they had settled the difference relative to Hinghee's shooting some of their people, on his late attack on the village. They informed me that there had been a very large meeting of Natives, from different parts; among whom were hundreds from the North Cape. The object of their meeting was to mourn and weep with Iopira, the Chief of Whangeroa, and to comfort him for the loss of his people. One of the Chiefs from Hingheehos informed me, that Iopira wished me to go to
