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journey.

When they found that we were resolved to visit the river, they insisted that we should not leave them for two nights. So this we agreed, as we were wet and weary; having been travelling, through bad roads, from an early hour, till about four o'clock in the afternoon. The Chief accommodated us with the best hut that he had, and our people with another. He also gave us a hog, and plenty of sweet and common potatoes. I presented him with an axe and a few trifles, with which he was much gratified.
