we Prayed, and that he did us good at all times
Shunghe behaved with much propriety, and said
that it was right we should pray, we then lay
down and enjoyed a good night's rest, —

On the 12th Octr 1819, this Morning we
intended to return to Paughee hoo after Breakfast,
Shunghe had a quantity of Sweet Potatoes dug
for us and our friends,

I was much Gratified with the progre-
-ss that had been made in our new Settlement
during our absence, a Considerable quantity of ground
had been broken up and Part of it Planted with
Maize, a Number of Seeds had been sown in the
Garden, which had been Brought to Port Jackson
from England and were up, the Vines were many
of them in leaf, The fruit trees, had also been planted
and the whole, Settlement began to put on the appear-
-ance of Civilization, than which nothing could be more
Gratifying to the Mind, A Building had also been
erected for the accommodations of the Labouring
Natives, From what I saw, I was Convinced that
all hands had been very busy, and that much
had been done in a short time with the small
means which Mr Butler and his Colleagues can
Command, —

About nine o'clock we left Kidde Kidde
and in our way down the Turr, Visited a Village
on the Banks Called Mootootee belonging to a Chief
