children who continually surrounded us. The head-chief was also gone to war so that we could not come to any final determination this day, and therefore returned on board in the evening.

Aug 5

Wednesday, the 6th. This day called a full committee of all the Missionaries at "Kiddie Kiddie" with the exception of the Rev. St. Williams, when the Resolutions of the parent committee, transmitted to me from London, were read and considered ~~was~~ until a very late hour. The evils censured in these communications could not be denied.

In reading these Resolutions, I endeavored to impress upon the committee, the importance of the different subjects they embraced, and cautioned them against the consequences of departing from their public duty in future. At a very late hour we closed our deliberation for the present, and deferred the ^{further} ~~future~~ consideration of these communications to a future ~~another~~ opportunity.
