of the Harbour. After the goods were sent off I accompanied the Rev. J. Butler, and Rev. H. Williams to the Head Chief, at Sarria's River. After meeting him and his people we returned to Raugheko where I held a Special Committee, when all the Missionaries were present excepting Mr. Hall who was absent on some other duty. We did not close our proceedings till midnight. At this Meeting the Resolutions of the Parent Society were brought under consideration a second time. The respective Salaries were arranged, and some other concerns connected with the Mission, when the Committee was adjourned to a future day.

Aug 12.

Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup>. This Morning we procured what boards and other sawed Timber we could from Mr. Hall for the purpose of erecting a temporary building for the reception of the Rev. H. Williams his stores &c at Pyhea in order that all his goods might be landed as soon as possible from the Braampton. We hired a large war-canoe to take the Boards &c to Mr. W's station about nine miles distant on the South side of the Harbour. We then proceeded on board the Braampton accompanied by the Rev. J. Butler & Messrs. Kemp and King, in order that they might render what assistance they could to the Rev. H. Williams in the landing his goods and securing them
