

with George the Chief of Wangarua, and inquired of him, if there were any Spars of Hoance at his land - he informed me there was, I promised to go over to see them and know whether his brother and he would consent to the Droimodary taking a cargo from there provided they would answer, and the following day Mr Hall took George on board the Droimodary in order that Capt. Skinner might converse with him on the subject - After this interview with George it was determined that Mess Mart and Hall should go round to Wangarua in a boat and I resolved to walk across the country from Hideo Hideo a distance of about 23 miles -

May 16 On the following Tuesday we set off - I arrived at George's settlement the same evening, and remained with he and his Brother all night - They were much pleased with my visit - The next morning Mess. Mart and Hall arrived

May 29 17
Monday

When the woods were examined and the Timber approved of by Mr Mart, and all matters arranged with the two Chiefs to the satisfaction of all parties, we left Georges Village in the Boat in order to return by sea. - About 10
