

O'Clock we went on shore, and lay on the beach
 till towards morning, when we proceeded down
 the River, and reached the heads of the Harbour
 before sunrise - The morning was very fine,
 when we first put to sea, but the weather
 soon changed, and the wind blew very strong,
 with a high sea, which compelled us to make
 for the shore when we left the boat in charge
 of the native crew, having determined to
 walk to Kianghee Loos - For this purpose
 we took two native guides and set off on
 our journey - we had a very laborious
 days walk, as the road was very bad, and
 the afternoon very rainy and stormy -

We arrived at a Native Village just
 at dark very wet where we took up our
 lodgings for the night, during the whole of
 which the storm continued - The next

morning it rained hard, and blew a very
 heavy gale, which continued the whole day

We proceeded on our route early, but
 met with many difficulties, from the
 Creeks, and Rivers being filled by the
 rains, several of which we had to ford

About seven O'Clock in the Evening we
 reached Kianghee Loos - This was
