Nov 2nd This morning we put to sea at an early hour and were favoured with a fair wind along the coast between Guam Head & Point Rodney - The shore between these two Points form a long Bay in which there appeared no Shelter, before we reached Point Rodney the Breeze became very strong & the sea grew pretty high - we sailed at a great rate and entered the mouth of the Thames about the middle of the day, when we made for one of the Islands in the River not considering ^{it} safe to remain at sea when the wind moderated we landed on a Cove about 2 O'clock where we dined and in the evening proceeded to the next Island situated on the west side of the River on reaching which we went on Shore for the night. I felt a grateful mind to the God of the Sea and the dry Land who had conducted us in safety thus far, while on the bosom of the great deep, and before we retired to rest we united in offering up our Evening Sacrifice of Praise & Thanksgivings to Him who holdeth the waters in the hollow of His hand - and whose presence fills Heaven & Earth

3rd This morning the wind was moderate, we left the Island at an early hour, and steered our course for Mayocca a populous Settlement situated on the main on the west side of the Thames, I had visited this Settlement three times before when
