Arrival he expressed his satisfaction at our visit -
told me he had got some hats ready for me and
produced a Basket neatly tied up containing
seven hats with which he presented me in pay-
ment for the articles I had before given him -
This was much more than I expected - I told him
we wanted an Hog or two - these he also supplied
us - I formed him that the object of our visit was
to examine the Harbour of Manukou, and that
we wished to go down to the Heads in order to see
if there was an entrance for ships - He told
me he would furnish a canoe in the morning
for the purposes I wished - Then asked him to
let us have a large empty Building about
80 feet long by 10 which was near the Beach
for the accommodation of ourselves and People
who had attended us from Nayoca which he readily
granted, and in this we took up our Lodgings for
the night -

Nov 10

10th As soon as the Tide answered we prepared
to visit the Heads of the Manukou River - This
[Olāhuhu]
River has two main Branches one runs up towards
Nayoca, and is separated from it by a very
narrow neck of Land, over which the natives take
their
