 they all have had their trials their fears  
 and their troubles - some allowance must  
 be made for their peculiar situation, their  
 wants of Christian Society, and the public  
 ordinances of Religion, such privileges as  
 are enjoyed by the Church of God in  
 England - I have a lofty tree upon one  
 of my Estates in N. S. Wales - It stands upon  
 the summit of a high Hill, when I find
