The Brampton when most of the Missionaries assembled in order to send off all the stores we could to Thoddee Thoddee before the Ship left her present anchorage. It was the intention of the Master to take the Ship this day to the South side of the Harbour about nine miles from where we lay. After the goods were sent off I accompanied the Revs J. Butler & H. Williams to the head of Jarvis's River, about six miles from the Cape, in order to fix upon another new station. After we had met the Chief and his people and determined upon the ground where the settlement was to be formed we gave directions to Natives to erect a temporary building for Mr J. Butler and his wife and they should immediately come and live among them as soon as it was ready. We afterwards returned to Pangehoo about 12 miles distant where we arrived about sunset. In the evening I called a special Committee when all the Missionaries were present, excepting Mr Valler Hall who
