day - Tuesday 12th This Morning we procured
what boards and other saved timber we could
from Mr William Hall for the purpose of erecting
a temporary Building for the reception of the
Rev. J. Williams and his baggage & stores
at Piheea in order that all his goods might
be landed as soon as possible from the Brampton
we hired a large War canoe to take the boards
&c. to Mr Williams's station about nine miles
distant on the South side of the Harbour. We
then proceeded on board the Brampton ac-
-companied by the Rev. J. Butler & Messrs. Kemp
& King in order that they might ren-
der what assistance they could to the
Rev. J. Williams in the landing his
