I replied he would act in that respect as he thought
proper, that as I had acquainted him verbally in what
relation he now stood to the Society it was a matter
of little consequence whether he opened my Letter or not
His conduct had compelled the Society to withdraw
its countenance and patronage from him and there
was now an end of their connexion. I informed him
that I was authorized to find him and his
Family a passage to N^o S. Wales and that he and
his Family could return with me in the Brampton
He still persisted in his determination to remain
