

we cleared the heads of Wangaroa with a strong  
 fair wind and about 7 O'clock the same evening  
 anchored in Horowhaka Bay, when I went on  
 board the Bussington for the night - There were  
 some chiefs on board - They spoke to me respecting  
 the Rev. F. Kendall's conduct and we had a long  
 conversation on the subject - I explained to them  
 the reason why Mr Kendall was no longer  
 considered as a Missionary, that he had  
 taken the daughter of a New Zealand chief  
 to live with him as his wife, which was  
 contrary to our customs and laws, and  
 that good men in England had only one wife  
 and that by so doing he had offended his friends.  
 They admitted he had done wrong but con-  
 tended that as he was not living with  
 the young woman now, his misconduct  
 should be forgotten - [ Aug 20<sup>th</sup>  
 Wednesday 20 - I have  
 been fully engaged this day in the diffe-  
 rent concerns of the Mission - Messrs Butler  
 and Hall & Kendall were all on board
