

other articles to Port Jackson for which they  
 had received in return Sea Sugar Flour  
 and such cloathing as they wanted and  
 that the New Zealanders might in time  
 have a Ship of their own to procure Sperm  
 oil Spouts &c which they could sell at  
 Port Jackson, and that many of them were  
 able to kill the Whales having been employed  
 on board the Whalers. When they got a vessel  
 of their own they would soon be equal to  
 the Otahetians and give over their cruel wars.  
 They expressed much pleasure in the idea  
 of having a vessel of their own to enable  
 them to procure what they want. After  
 we had closed our conversation upon these  
 subjects I called their attention to Mr Hendall's  
 conduct in another respect. I told them  
 that the Gentlemen who had sent Mr  
 Hendall to New Zealand were not only  
 angry with him for selling Muskets  
 and Powder but for having two wives  
 that in England a Man was only  
 allowed to have one wife - that King  
 George himself could only have one wife  
 that the Gov<sup>r</sup> at Port Jackson had only  
 one, that Mr Hendall had violated  
 our Laws and our Religion, and that  
 for being guilty of so great an offence  
 he had been dismissed from the service  
 of the Society and he was at liberty  
 now to act as he thought proper -
