 Mr Kendall should not be punished any
 more as he was not now living with
 her Sister — She said when Thungee
 returned from the Boas he would
 not allow the Missionaries to live
 at Middle Holee — I replied if Thungee
 did not wish the Missionaries to live
 at his place I would send a Ship
 and take them to Port Jackson, and
 that the Missionaries did not come
 to New Zealand for any thing that
 they had to give them — for they
 had plenty of provisions and clothes
 in their own country — I appealed
 to her Husband and Brother who
 both had lived with me, if we had
 not plenty of every thing in Port
 Jackson, and did not want any
 thing from them — which they
 admitted — That the Missionaries
 came only for their good and
 when they wished them to leave
