at the station of the Rev. A Williams in the
Cawa Cawa. where I had summoned all the
Missionaries to attend - he set upon public business
until a late hour, and afterwards remained
in his Hut for the night - ^{SEP 2} Sep. 2. This morn-
-ing we closed the business we entered upon
last night I now considered all the public
concerns arranged as far as I could - After
Breakfast I went on board the Brampton
and agreed with the master for the passage
of the following persons to Port Jackson - The
Rev. Mr & Mrs Leigh, the Rev. J Thendall
and family, and Mr Cavell & family
being 15 persons in the whole & afterwards
called upon Mr Thendall to arrange with
him for the delivering up of all the public
stores in his possession, and purchased his
saved timber towards building the Rev.
Mr Williams House &c. and afterwards
crossed the Harbour to inform Mr Williams
what I had done, in order that he might
take immediate steps to remove the Stores
Timber &c to prevent any disputes with
the Natives afterwards, when Mr Thendall
was gone; and then proceeded to Thiddee
Thiddee where I arrived after dark extremely
cold, having been several hours upon
the water - Wednesday ^{Sep. 3} Sep. 3. To-day
I took my leave of Thiddee Thiddee
with an intention to return no more
this voyage - I went to visit Mr
Samuel Butlers Station about 14 miles
