we had met with nothing material during our

part of the way -

Aug 12 - the southward of the Cape, and before 12. O. Clock
saw the north Head of the Bay of Islands
but the wind was ^{unfavorable} ~~against us~~ - In the evening
we arrived opposite the mouth of the Harbour
but could not work in, as the wind was directly
against us - we observed the Brig Queen
Charlotte a few miles to seaward of the
brampton, working up - both vessels lay
on and off during the night -

ward, working up into the Harbour with
a contrary wind - The brampton being light

she did not hold her wind - In working up
we had stood in, ^{one} ~~or~~ tack pretty far over
to the south side of the Harbour - when the

ship was put about, she struck upon a
rock, but received no injury - In the evening
at dusk we came to anchor in Kevanika
Bay about nine miles from the missionary
