that the Rev. S. Leigh was very ill, and that  
it would be necessary to recall Mr. D. M. Sheppard  
again to the Bay of Islands, as the tribe to whom  
he had been originally sent required his return.  
The station the Rev. S. Leigh has fixed upon is a  
very important one, and I hope the mission  
will succeed in that very spot where so many  
of our countrymen were sacrificed and  
eaten by the natives - The Rev. Mr. Jernon &  
Mr. Hobbs set off as soon as they could to  
Waniporon by land, taking with them a  
native guide - I am determined to settle  
the Rev. W. Williams at a new station in  
the Bay of Islands on the South side of the  
Lakelse in order to see their colleagues  
and to consult measures for the removal  
of themselves and baggage to their intended  
station - It appeared to me very providential  
that the Rev. S. Leigh had fixed upon this place  
for their missionary labours, as they might keep a  
communication with the missionaries of the  
C. M. S. by land, and be of mutual advantage  
to each other - I now determined to settle
