from the Bay the preceding day belonged
to the young King Pomare; that the Tahitians
had sent oil and various other Articles to
Port Jackson, for which they had received
in return Sea Sugar, Flour, and such
Clothing as they wanted; and that the New
Zealanders might in time have a ship of
their own to procure Spanish oil, Spans
and which they could sell at Port Jackson.
and that many of them were able to
kill the whales having been employed
on board the whalers - when they got a
Vessel, of their own, they would soon be
equal to the Tahitians, and give over
their cruel wars - They expressed much
Pleasure in the Idea, of having a Vessel
of their own, to enable them to procure
what they want.

After we had closed our
Conversations upon these Subjects, I called their
Attention to Mr Kendall's Conduct in another
Respect. I told them that the Gentlemen who
had sent Mr Kendall to their Island, were
not only angry with him for selling
muskets and Powder, but for having
two wives - that in England a man was only
allowed to have one wife - that King George
himself could only have one wife; that
the Governor at Port Jackson had only
one; that Mr Kendall had violated our
