

arrived, - I was apprehensive the Brampton  
would be ready for sea before I had  
completed the object of my visit to New  
Zealand; and the Captain informed me  
he would sail immediately the ship was  
ready -

Dec. 24. I entered this morning into the consideration  
of the salaries allowed the Rev. J. Muller  
and his son. Mr. Muller wished me to confirm  
the bills he had drawn upon England  
and to allow him the same salary for him-  
self & son for the last year which he had  
drawn for the former year - At this  
rate their salaries for two years from the  
1<sup>st</sup> of Oct. 1821. to 1<sup>st</sup> Oct. 1823 would  
have amounted to £6000. This I  
objected to - I had considerable difficulty in  
settling his account, and never could close  
it to my own satisfaction - About one

o'clock I left Hedde Hedde to fix upon a  
new station for Mr. Sheppard on my  
way down the river I went up the  
river mypoppa which falls into the  
Hedde Hedde, to see if I could find a  
fall of water convenient for a water mill  
at some future period - I met with a  
very suitable situation for the purpose  
very central to all the missionary  
stations - A boat may go up at all
