

Determined to return to the Bay of Islands, for which we immediately made sail with a fine breeze, and arrived at the mouth of the Harbour at the close of the evening - The wind being now against us we lay off and on all night

Jan. 30. This morning was very fine. we had made little progress during the night, and the wind still continued against us. About eleven o'clock A.M. we observed a boat making toward the ship. when she came along side, we found she was from Wauyavoua with the Rev. Mr. White who was going to Keddee Keddee. I immediately left the Prumptor with Mr. White - we called on our way at Kanyeloo; and then proceeded to Keddee Keddee, where we arrived in the evening - The Rev. S. Leigh & Mrs. Leigh had left the Prumptor when she sailed to Voolookakha, as he was very weak & poorly, and had taken up their lodgings with the Rev. J. Mutter - we found all the other brethren well.

Jan. 31 - This day the Rev. J. Mutter read prayers, & I preached when we administered the Holy Sacrament. Present the Rev. S. Leigh & White, Mrs. Leigh, Mutter, Keypat Mrs. Sheppard, Mrs. Pichey, & Mrs. Frank Sheppard & Pichey - Now thank God should Christians be for the Sabbaths and ordinances of Religion - what earnest and support do they administer to the poor soul, without the Divine ordinances, how feeble and how languid would be the state of Christians be I
