on the Coast, and had made Peace with them; and
that great numbers had been cut off - He showed me where
he had been struck three times with a ball - His Helmet
saved him once, and his Coat of mail once, and
a ball had hit his thigh - After Dinner I accompanied
the Rev. Mr. Williams to his Station where I remained
for the night -

9th This Day I spent with the Rev. Mr. Williams - I am happy
to see him go on so well - He and his Family are
now comfortably settled, and are happy in their
new Situation - I think they will prove a great
help in to the mission - He is a man of a Superior
Character, and better informed than any who have
hitherto been employed in this mission - I hope he
will be able to correct, and remedy in time many
evils that have existed, and also to set an Example
to the rest what they as missionaries should do -

10th This morning I left the Rev. Mr. Williams, and
proceeded to Munganaue, where Mr. J. Butler
is stationed about 16 miles distant - On my
Arrival there I met with the Rev. J. Butler & Mr.
Williams both, we fired upon the Place where
the new ^{House} ~~House~~ is to stand - most of the men
are on the Spot - It is an excellent Station
