said, and it could not be foreseen what might
happen, if he was not removed. While we were
talking in the Garden two Chiefs came in, and wished
to know if I was angry with Mr. B. They also
mentioned that they had been told that Shonghee
had said Mr. B. should not remain at Kiddee
Kiddee - we enquired from whom they had
received their information, they immediately told
us, from which Mr. B. was convinced what Mr.
Prepvoir had been made upon Shonghee's mind
in his last interview with Mr. Kendall - Mr.
Kendall when he was at Kiddee Kiddee on the 11th
instants, told me he would bring his family
up to the Settlement, and fix them in sight of
the Society's Store, where they should remain
until they starved to death - This declaration
shewed the desperate state of his mind; and
how he is governed by unsubdued passions -
After many arguments Mr. B. saw Mr. Kendall
came to Kiddee Kiddee, that he could not remain.
Mr. B. was greatly agitated - he had many painful
reflections; and the charge, of later Melvick
to answer for, as I told him it was impossible
for me to look over ^{such a charge} without an investigation
without committing myself and the Interest
of the mission - I recommended him to
accept well, the charge, and the probability
of his conviction before he attempted to justify
his conduct.
