It appeared to Mr. & myself,
that this stipulation was reason-
able. — We have blessed the
Mission Soc^y to pay for the food
of the children (& of the wife also
if she is not to be a schoolmistress)
so that Government is to be put
to no expense on this acct. either
on the board or on shore. And Dr.
Thurst says, that the payment
~~for~~ for this food by the Society
shall be at the same rate as if
it were by Government, if the rules
of the service will admit of this
without introducing an unnecessary
disturbance; — We explained to his
