We arrived here yesterday, after a very  
pleasant passage - My family has hitherto experienced  
nothing of the sea sickness except Mr. Kendall & two  
of the children slightly, and I have the pleasure  
to say, that we are all happy & well.

When I last saw Mr. Wilberforce he  
expressed a wish to see me before I left Town.  
Be pleased the first time you see him, to present  
to him my grateful acknowledgments & tell him  
I am very sorry for my neglect, which was chiefly  
owing to Mrs. Kendall's reluctance to part with  
me after she came on board the Tail Finca.  
Any commands which he may have to Mr  
Harden, if he will convey them by you I will  
however with pleasure oblige him, should it  
please Divine Providence to conduct me in  
safety to New South Wales.
