Brood & Dear Sir May 4/13

Am<sup>d</sup>. May 7/13 <sup>to</sup> 6 Decem. - 50 M. R. 103 - 6 gross 40 shillings - and 10 more shillings to be repaid by Mr. Wood.

I have received 35 Bibles and 20 Testaments from the Mr. M'Guey together with your parcel. The Commission brought them on board himself; he visited me & my family in our Apartment, and I have been treated with great respect both by him & his Lady.

I have not received the Missionary Register No. 3 - if you send it, you will have the goodness to do it immediately.

I am sorry I could not receive Mr. M'Guey with respect to the wife of Dawson's the Prisoner Mr. Hunt told me at first, that I might take a Servant, but Mr. Kendall was content to do without one, we had not therefore a bed provided for one to sleep in.

The Brood Mr. Hale will do well to take possession of his Boat as soon as Captain Young has given orders to have it fitted up for him. It is finished. I could explain my reasons for this kind. I fully expected that he would have come on board this ship as soon as he was ordered, I should have written to him; but I did not know his address.
