notwithstanding, it should seem desirable to establish a vessel in compliance

with M<sup>r</sup> Marsden's proposals, I am further to inquire whether the mode of

effecting the object detailed in the enclosed Address to the friends of Missions

would meet the concurrence of the Directors, and whether they would

recommend and promote it.

I am directed to state that the Committee do not take up the design as a

matter connected with this Society, but are disposed to support and

recommend it as likely to be Generally advantageous to Missionary

undertakings in the Pacific Ocean.
