Dear Sir,

Yours of the 3. is before us & agreeable to your request we have spoken to our Captain J<sup>r</sup>. Arrowsmith about the Cabin Passage.

He says the customary charge for a Cabin Passenger to Ponduras out is £50 each.

When the Captain finds fresh provisions &c. On this occasion he says he will only charge £25 for each Passenger (if they must lay in their own stock of fresh Provisions, live Stock & wines <sup>if necessary</sup> which will be £12.10 for each Passenger to be paid to the Captain.

Captain Arrowsmith thinks it will be better to lay in the Stock of fresh Provisions at Seal which he commonly does for himself, as there is frequently great risk in buying them in running up from this Port to the Downs at this season of the year.

The Trunks & such like packages may be

easily taken in at the Downs.

We shall further advise you the day  
the vessel sails from Shields, that Mr & Mrs  
Moore may leave London for Deal im-  
-mediately on receipt of our letter.

It is scarcely necessary for us to observe  
that some of the Inns at Deal are extremely  
expensive, while there are ~~some~~ <sup>others</sup> usually  
frequented by Captains of Merchant vessels  
very moderate & very comfortable.

When they arrive at Deal let Mr. Moore put  
a letter into the Post office address'd to Capt<sup>n</sup>  
Arrowsmith Ship Clerk, informing him  
of his residence.

Though not personally known to the  
Rev Mr. Pratt we return our acknowledg-  
-ments for his kind regards express'd in  
your letter & earnestly pray that the  
Blessing of God our Saviour may attend all  
his laborious exertions to promote  
His Cause & the everlasting welfare of  
mankind, & we shall feel ourselves

honour? in having it in our power, at any  
future day, to assist your object in promoting  
the cause of Christ at Honduras, or elsewhere.

In reference to yourself my dear Sir, if you  
are the author of the Treatise on the perusal  
of the Holy Scriptures I should be wanting in  
gratitude, if I did not acknowledge my  
personal obligation to that little work &  
to you as the writer of it. I trust it has been  
of use to me & with the blessing of God I hope it
