Yours of the 3. is before us & agreeable to
your request we have spoken to our Captain
J^r. Arrowsmith about the Cabin Passage

He says the customary charge for a Cabin
Passenger to Ponduras out is £50 each.

When the Captain finds fresh provisions &c. it
On this occasion he says he will only charge
£25 for each Passenger (if they must lay in
their own stock of fresh Provisions, live
Stock & wines ^{if necessary} which will be £12.10 for each
Passenger to be paid to the Captain.

Captain Arrowsmith thinks it will be
better to lay in the Stock of fresh Provisions
at Seal which he commonly does for him-
self, as there is frequently great risk in buying
them in running up from this Port to the
Downs at this season of the year.
